Club News and Writings

Lani Herrmann 1936-2021

Longtime SFFMC member and folk music luminary Lani Herrmann died in Hana, Hawaii in early December. She was 85 years old.

I first remember seeing Lani at SFFMC's New Year's Camp in 1983-84, the final one at Camp Bothin. She was leading a song I had never heard before. We crossed paths at many song and tune sessions in the 30 or so years after that. I heard her lead many songs, most of which I had not heard sung by anyone else. She also sung rounds in several languages, leading many rounds workshops at the San Francisco Free Folk Festival and Camp Harmony. She sang harmony vocals on Gordon Bok's album Another Land Made of Water. She wrote the great Christmas parody song The Pickle Tree Carol. She also wrote A Sharing Round, on page 7 of this folknik.

Lani was also a very good fiddle player, playing tunes from multiple traditions. She played



other instruments too: banjo, guitar, English concertina and possibly others. She led the Starry Plough Irish ceili band in Berkeley for many years. She played fiddle on at least three Folk Legacy albums, including Archie Fisher's 1976 The Man with the Rhyme.

Lani first encountered the folk revival in college in Chicago in the 1950s, and her contributions to the folk community went well beyond her own playing and singing. As a newcomer to the Washington DC area in 1964, she was one of the co-founders of the Folklore Society of Greater Washington (FSGW) which is still active today. She edited and produced several songbooks including Gordon Bok's and Bill Staines's. She co-edited the 1990 book *Sam Henry's Songs of the People*, a 700-page collection of Irish songs in English. She designed album covers or booklets for at least nine Folk Legacy records.

In recent years Lani's health began to fail, and she and her husband Cal Herrmann moved to Hawaii, where Lani had grown up and where she and Cal got married in 1961. In my mind, I can still see and hear her singing, with her hand raised and her index finger pointing upwards and a little smile on her face. Rest in peace, Lani.

November Board Meeting Highlights

Finances: There were questions about the use of Square and Stripe. Daniel explained that we use PayPal for donations, Square for sales, and Stripe for membership dues paid on the website using Paid Memberships Pro. Since Covid-19 we haven't used Square but will do so once in-person events start up. Paid Memberships Pro would require a more expensive version of PayPal to accept credit and debit cards.

MailChimp: This program gives the Club an opportunity to reach all of our members. We will

keep notices to once a month except for emergency situations.

Board Elections: The following Board members were up for two-year terms ending Sept 2023: Dave Sahn, Jerry Michaels, Charlie Fenton, Ed Hilton, Amelia Hogan. Each of these Board members were voted on individually and accepted unanimously, with the nominee abstaining.

Mermaids and Their Tools

The Latin word for mirror (speculum) has given us the verb to speculate; originally speculation was scanning the sky and the related movement of the stars by means of a mirror. The Latin for star (sidus) has also given us the word 'consideration,' which, etymologically, means to scan all the visible stars together. Both abstract nouns are rooted in the study of the stars reflected in mirrors.

Worldwide, mirrors have been linked with

magic and divination because they can reflect past or future events as well as present ones. According to legend, Pythagoras had a magic mirror that he, like the Thessalian witches, would turn toward the Moon before reading the future in it. Shamans in central Asia aimed mirrors at the sun or moon in order to read the future. The robes of these shamans were often decorated with mirrors.

A magical mirror that enables its user to see past, present, and future is a classic theme of Muslim literature. Recall the folk tale Snow White: 'Mirror, mirror, on the wall, who is the fairest of them all?' In Scotland, mirror divination was associated with Halloween. It was a custom for young women to look into moonlit mirrors on October 31 in order to see their future lovers or husbands. The mirror may have been a kind of Celtic portable reflective substitute for water, allowing a druid or priest to peer in to this alternative spiritual world at any time, as the fortune-teller uses a crystal ball.

Combs are ancient tools, used both to untangle hair and to remove parasites. In European folk tradition, the mermaid's comb is frequently described as golden, and provides any human who manages to acquire the object with the ability to control the mermaid. In Hans Christian Andersen's "The Snow Queen", golden combs pulled through the victims' hair makes them forget. In the Brothers Grimm story "The Nix of the Mill Pond," a golden comb is used by a wife to summon her husband from the mill-pond, where he has been taken by a beautiful water-dwelling woman.

Those being chased by witches, in tales from Ireland to Russia, are said to be advised to throw a comb over their shoulder, which they hope will spring into a forest of trees or teeth through which the witch must struggle. Throwing a mirror before the witch has been said to create a deep lake the witch must swim, row over, or circumvent. Who can forget the tiny Slavic children being pursued by the hideous Baba Yaga, who plunges into the lake in her magic mortar, and rapidly crosses it, using her great pestle as a paddle? It is good that they have other instruments of protection, such as the comb, and their innate kindness and innocence, which befriend every article or creature the witch would use to

capture them.

In Ireland, banshees, female spirits whose appearance signals a forthcoming death, also possess combs, although these are usually silver rather than gold. Combs and the act of combing, therefore, seem to be associated with females from the Otherworld, and possess magical qualities relating to control or prophesy.

If we regard the mirror as providing a portal to the spirit world, with the reflection symbolizing a window into that world, and the comb or the act of combing as part of the process of divination, then the purpose of these two symbols becomes clearer: the mermaid or banshee is divining the future, perhaps the foretelling of a specific event using the tools of her trade, and, sometimes, passing that message from the Otherworld to our own.

We learn from old church history that the hair of the priest or bishop was combed several times during divine services by one of the inferior clergy. The comb is mentioned as one of the essentials for use during a high mass when sung by a bishop, and in English and foreign cathedrals, combs were valued among the costly possessions of the church. Among the combs specially known to history are those of St. Neot, St. Dunstan, and Malachias. That of St. Thomas the Martyr of Canterbury is still to be seen in the Church of the Sepulchre at Thetford, and that of St. Cuthbert, at Durham Cathedral. From sundry references in old legends, it seems probable that this object of pagan veneration was deemed prudent to adopt by early Christian teachers, who invested it with new significance.

The combing of the bishop's hair may have indicated an act of purification. Pagan priests or druids may have used combs for a similar purpose, to purify themselves and rid themselves of symbolic or spiritual cooties, presumably to aid communication with the spirit world. This also suggests a purpose for the comb in the hand of the mermaid: she is not only able, via a reflection in her mirror, to see into the spirit world, but also to comb through obstacles or to facilitate communication between our world and that of the spirits. There are old tales of mermaids appearing to guide ships away from rocks or danger, or to save a seaman's life. The contradiction between the sailor's desire to throw

himself into the water to enjoy the beautiful creature and the fear that she, desiring pleasure, will take him underwater, where he will drown, provides great mystery and a thrill of danger. It is strange that the mermaid's appearance and powers have been, for the past few centuries, considered a threat or forewarning to sailors, or a prophecy of shipwreck or death.

Mermaids have been depicted in heraldry as holding also a trident, a wreath, a harp, a scepter, or a giant shell, all objects associated with magic and mythic power.

Sir George Head explains the appearance of the comb and glass as expected natural illusions adding to the mermaid mystique...the mermaid is perceived, but it is really the seal, or sea-calf ... the claws of the seal, as well as the head, he writes, are like a lady's back-hair comb; therefore, supposing some resemblance of the sea-water streaming down its polished neck on a sunny day to a looking-glass, we may add another possible explanation to the fabulous literature of the marine maiden, or mermaid, and the appendages of her mysterious vanity, power, or tools.

Professor Tara E. Pedersen suggests that the mirror held in the hand of the mermaid suggests the lack of power that Neptune held over his wife. "He may...be King of the Seas, but his paramour, (the mermaid, his goddess), in spite of what he may like to believe, is not ultimately subject to his command." "As she glides across the water, the sun, which she nourishes, turns the sea into a mirror for her own image. She sees, not her husband, but her own reflection."

Bill Staines

Folk musician and singer-songwriter from New Hampshire Bill Staines passed away on December 5, 2021, at age 74. He died only three weeks after he was diagnosed with an aggressive form of cancer.

Bill began his professional career in the early 1960s in the Cambridge area. He began touring nationwide a few years later.

Songs that he wrote include many that are beloved and heard regularly at folk gatherings in general and at SF Folk Club events in particular: "Bridges", "Crossing the Water", "Sweet Wyoming Home", "The Roseville Fair", "A Place in the Choir", "Child of Mine", and "River". He also wrote, recorded, and performed children's songs.
