2023 SF Free Folk Festival: live and in person on Saturday July 8!

SFFMC's San Francisco Free Folk Festival will be live and in person this year, for the first time since 2019! It will be an outdoor event on Saturday, July 8, from 12 noon until 6 pm in the Music Concourse area of Golden Gate Park, between the DeYoung Museum and the California Academy of Sciences. Information on the festival site, parking, and how to get there is here.

Performances will be on the bandshell stage at one end of the Music Concourse and will be co-sponsored by Illuminate, which hosts an ongoing concert series there. Workshops will be near the fountains in the middle of the concourse. The whole event is co-sponsored by San Francisco Recreation & Parks.

The festival needs volunteers! Please sign up to volunteer here.

This year's festival will include 11 stage performances, 12 singing/song workshops, six instrumental workshops and sessions, four dance workshops, and a storytelling performance and workshop. SFFMC's "July 4" and Labor Day weekend gatherings coming soon

SFFMC has now had four very successful multi-day musical gatherings at Camp Herms, a

20-acre Boy Scout camp high in the El Cerrito hills. We'll return again to Camp Herms on the weekend before July 4, from 6 pm Friday afternoon June 30 until Sunday evening July 2, and again and for a bit longer on Labor Day weekend, from Friday afternoon, September 1 until Monday, September 4th.

Rates for adults are still \$15/day for day use, or \$25/night, per person. Kids under 15 are \$10/day for day use, \$10/night, per person. We strongly encourage all who come to camp to be vaccinated and boosted for covid-19.

Most attendees come for day use, but there is also a lot of room for tent and RV camping. There is no pre-registration or pre-payment. Please bring cash or checks made out to SFFMC.

mature trees and more open vistas to surrounding hills, some recent dorm-style field cabins across from the dining hall, a few red cabins, and one of the motel buildings. What's new? Central camp now features three major buildings: the modern spacious Dining Hall, which will be available to us around the clock for meals and much else; the Community Center, which includes a proper wooden floor in a gracious new hall for dancing, and The Lodge, with residential rooms plus public rooms suitable for workshops and activities. Beyond central camp there is new housing similar to the field cabins that survived the fire, and a new Wellness Lodge. All buildings are accessible with new ramps and virtually no threshold steps; adjacent decks, patios, and plazas link the site. Designed-for-privacy genderneutral restrooms are in all new buildings, and everywhere is reliable heating and plumbing. We are pleased that Newman can now accommodate RVs and tent camping at designated locations.

What to anticipate? Expect fresh and comfortable workshop spaces, a range of housing choices, and three hearty meals daily. The Bus will help get you and your gear around the site to customary revels — nightly dances and concerts, singing at dinner (oh, we've missed those harmonies!), jamming and friendship at all hours, ale-tasting, New Year's Eve festivities, and all your favorite Harmony pastimes. When the sun shines, enjoy soaking up winter rays on numerous plazas and decks. After dark, gather around established gas fire pits at strategic locations, or by the indoor fireplace in The Lodge.

Registration will open in the fall, and all SFFMC members will receive an email announcing it. Only SFFMC members are eligible to attend Camp Harmony, and you can check your membership status on the SFFMC website. As everywhere in these times, rates will be somewhat higher than in the past, so plan ahead. Camperships will be available and donations toward them are always welcomed.

We look forward to seeing you at Harmony!

Book Review: Woody Guthrie, American Radical

SOCIALISMO, by Woody Guthrie, January 21, 1948 My name is Socialism And I was born in you a good

long time ago.

But I do grow slow.

And I grew up fighting. But always was your best working child, and your happiest one.

If I do happen to tear a part
of your house down on my
way growing up towards your
sky, don't you be afraid.

I'll fix it back a whole lot better than I found it. I want to raise my own kids

in a better house.

Author Will Kaufman uses Woody's obscure poem SOCIALISMO to introduce his 2011 biography. Years ago I read two older biographies, Joe Klein's 1980 "Woody Guthrie, a Life" and Ed Cray's 2004 "Ramblin' Man, The Life and Times of Woody Guthrie". Faith Petric had recommended the Cray book to me, and when it was published Pete Seeger called it the definitive Guthrie book. A piece of trivia I recall from it: Woody was named after Woodrow Wilson as he was born in 1912, twelve days after Wilson was nominated as the Democrats' Presidential candidate.

Kaufman cites Woody's daughter Nora Guthrie of the Woody Guthrie Foundation and Archives at the top of his list for acknowledgements, as the book contains much unpublished material, letters, songs, essays, and many quotations by Woody. It focuses more on Woody's "radical activism" than earlier biographies, and doesn't shy away from his dark side and his contradictions. But even these are tempered with understanding and sometimes humor. In discussing Woody's sexism and misogyny the book quotes Woody's most faithful disciple, Ramblin' Jack Elliott, who said, "My wives always mentioned Woody Guthrie in the papers as a reason why they would divorce me."

The book includes my favorite Woody story, which also appeared in the earlier two biographies. When Woody lived in New York City in 1940 and wrote a column "Woody Sez" in the Peoples World, he claimed, "The five o'clock trains was so crowded today you couldn't even fall down. I changed stations twice and both times I come out with a different pair of shoes on." I was unfamiliar with Woody's anti-war version of the old song "Farther Along", which includes this verse and chorus.

Why do the War Ships sail on the ocean?

Why do the bombs drop from the sky?

Why can't we work and have peace and plenty?

We'll understand it all by and by!
Chorus: Farther along we'll know all about it;
Farther along we'll understand why
Poor man is poor, and the rich man gets
richer;

We'll understand it all by and by!

Woody's "Farther Along" is not included in the extensive list of his songs and their lyrics at https://www.woodyguthrie.org/Lyrics/Lyrics.htm

Another quotation that made me smile was by Woody's son Arlo. Many years after Woody died in 1967 he adorned a US postage stamp. This prompted Arlo to quip, "For a man who fought all his life against being respectable, this comes as a stunning defeat." American Radical also includes Arlo's recollection of when Woody came home from being treated for Huntington's disease and taught Arlo the final, rarely-sung three verses to "This Land is Your Land", so they wouldn't be forgotten. Readers might be interested in the old article I wrote "This Land Is Your Land and Pete Seeger", which was published in two issues of the folknik, for Sept-Oct 2005 and Nov-Dec 2005, see http://old.sffmc.org/archives/sep05/clubnews.html and

My article has an anecdote about "This Land Is Your Land" and Arlo's amusing answer to a question about it that Pete Seeger asked him for me. The article also includes some of Pete's wisdom that he shared with my chorus at our rehearsal before a big benefit concert with him in 1992.

Much of the book, as befits its subtitle, deals with Woody's political activism. This includes a chapter "Long Road to Peekskill", which describes the shocking attacks by Klansmen and others at civil rights benefit concerts in 1949 in Peekskill, New York. The photos and the recollections by Paul Robeson, Lee Hayes, Pete Seeger, Woody and others made me cringe. Fortunately, no one was seriously injured, and the chapter concludes with this upbeat message, "Racists are not born, but made; and they can be unmade."

The following chapter, "The Last Free Place in America", describes the anti-Communist scare of the 1950s that put American folk music under siege. Country and western singer Tex Ritter later recalled, "At one time I called myself a folk singer. [But] it got to the point there for a few years where it was very difficult to tell where folk music ended and Communism began. So that's when I quit calling myself a folk singer. It was the sting of death

if you were trying to make a living." The hearings of the House Un-American Activities Committee (HUAC) and the McCarran Senate Internal Security Subcommittee led to the Weavers, Woody and many other musicians being blacklisted for many years. At the committee hearings Burl Ives named names, Lee Hayes of the Weavers took the Fifth, and Pete Seeger courageously refused to testify based on his First Amendment rights, for which he spent 7 years under threat of a ten-year jail sentence. Kaufman observes that it remains a mystery why Woody was never called before either committee. Some factors may have been that his crippling disease was causing him to be less musically active, although he remained very outspoken, and the fact that he was never a card-carrying member of the Communist Party of the USA, despite writing for its publications.

Here are some nuts and bolts about the book. It's well-researched, with 37 pages of (end) Notes, 12 pages of Sources, and a useful 14-page Index. One endnote states that "Country Joe McDonald deserves credit for inaugurating the practice of putting music to Guthrie's unreleased lyrics with 'Woman at Home' in 1975." This is in reference to a discussion in the book of how in recent years Woody's unpublished lyrics have been put to music, leading to collaborations "from beyond the grave" between him and contemporary musicians such as Eliza Gilkyson ("Peace Call") and Janis Ian ("I Hear You Sing Again"). The book has a sprinkling of interesting B & W photos, like a 1943 close-up of the Almanac Singers Agnes "Sis" Cunningham, Cisco Houston, Woody, Pete Seeger, and Bess Lomax Hawes, that I would have enjoyed more of. The only erratum I spotted in the 204 pages of text was where the book asserts that Arlo's song "Alice's Restaurant" came out in 1977. It actually came out in 1967, when I was a grad student at Berkeley and the real Alice's aunt was a secretary in my department. A few months before Alice came to the Bay Area to visit her aunt asked me if I would show her around, since I had told the aunt about my going to the annual Berkeley Folk Festivals of the 60s. I said of course, even though I had only a motorcycle and a bicycle, but I never even met Alice. Not long before Alice's visit the song took off, and the aunt later told me that she was fortunate to

spend a little time with Alice, what with her agent taking her to various promotional gigs!

Correspondence: Marian sent a letter to Marlene thanking her for her years of service as Treasurer.

Finances: Dave reports that the Club tax return was prepared by David Simon and everything is correct. All ten Board members plus Marlene and Amelia are listed. Motion by Daniel, seconded by Ed, that we approve the draft tax return as sent to us with possible changes as mentioned. Approved unanimously.

Faith's Archives: Holy Names University (off Park Boulevard in Oakland) ceased operation last semester and the buildings have been sold as of Friday. Charlie forwarded the June 9 article from the Chronicle to everyone. (The day after the Board meeting Marian spoke to Faith's daughter Carol. They are supposed to return the archives to her.)

Vaccination policy for the Club: We have had vaccination requirements for our campouts. Charlie reported that the Bay Area Country and Dance Society has dropped the requirement as did the Freight & Salvage. Daniel suggested that we state as our Club policy that vaccinations are strongly encouraged but no longer required. Masking is encouraged. It's no longer clear if you are protected by someone else's vaccination. There have been breakouts at camps even with people being vaccinated. Thad: in crowds of hundreds about five people wear masks. Some people feel that relaxing requirements are unsafe. BACDS website has a link to their Covid policy. We could

paraphrase their statement. Daniel made a motion that we alter our vaccination policy. Our general policy now will be that vaccinations and boosters are very strongly encouraged, but it will be left to the discretion of organizers of individual events if they wish to adhere to stricter policy. Charlie seconded. Approved unanimously. Ed will contact Joan to let her know regarding the Pickin' & Fiddlin' gathering. Josh will need to update their website.

Camp Herms: Ed had a small group around the campfire. He will continue to put energy into keeping the campfire going.

Hali's report: We did well! Remember that we only used to get about 35 people when we camped at Mark's in Boulder Creek. The weather wasn't good, but there was heat in the Lodge and plenty of room in there. Some people still opted for the outdoors and there was a fire available (thanks, Ed!) I deposited \$2455 in our Bank of the West account plus there was a \$60 allotment from a member's yearly donation, so our total for the camp was \$2,515. We only lost \$185 on the camp which was much better than I expected. Several people rounded up to \$20 for their day use and there were a lot of donations.

Here's the breakdown:

Friday - 14 people, 9 overnight and 5 day use. Saturday - 70 people, 10 overnight and 60 day use Sunday - 46 people, 7 overnight and 39 day use

I talked to Ranger Sean and he's fine with having us come in Friday night for July 4 weekend camp.

The other group who has booked for day use will be there, using the Lodge and facilities, until around 6 or so Friday night. He wasn't sure of their time frame and asked me to check with Nathalie.

They will be back Monday morning around 7 am and need the entire parking lot and Quarry so it's best that we vacate Sunday night.

I spoke to Nathalie (who took over for Melissa) asking when the other group actually leaves. I told her we'd like to come in Friday night and leave Sunday night for our 48-hour period. She

said they will be gone by 6 pm so we can come in at that time.

We can clean up Sunday after dinner time and Ranger Sean is fine with us staying afterward in the Lodge to play music.

SFFFF: Daniel reported that it is less than a month away. Things are going well. There is an 800-space garage that is expensive. You can park in the neighborhood, but space may be limited. There are a few spaces for disabled parking. JFK Drive is closed, MLK Drive is open. The Free Fest website has the information on their site. People are needed to help with the SFFFF table. There is a Facebook event page and people are encouraged to say they are going, invite others and share the Facebook page, the SF Folk Club group and event page. Get KALW to announce on their shows (Tangents, JoAnn Mar, Kevin Vance), have people send to their individual groups.

Cyprian's and Tuesday afternoon groups: Ed reports that they are still on Zoom. This may move somewhat if they know our Covid policy has changed. The vicar who had been there and knew us has left.

ECFFF: The festival has been approved by the El Cerrito Arts Commission for October 14, the second Saturday in October, at the El Cerrito Community Center off Moeser Lane, the same place we've been at for the past two years.

Camp Harmony: The committee made a site visit to the new Camp Newman. There are meeting spaces and a new dance space where the wellness lodge had been. The new dining hall is huge and can be divided into three parts. Tammy is no longer in the kitchen but the person in charge is a highly regarded chef. They are very happy to have us back. We will have a special dispensation for alcohol. They are still building more facilities. We will need to rent a bus as the terrain is still the same. RVs and tents will be allowed, and this will be cheaper than sleeping in the buildings. There will be various levels of pricing for the accommodations. There will be limited parking.
