# New Online Exhibit on the Berkeley Folk Music Festival (1958-1970)

For anyone interested in the history of the Bay Area folk scene, there's now a great online exhibit called *The Berkeley Folk Music Festival & the Folk Revival on the US West Coast* at <u>https://sites.northwestern.edu/bfmf</u>. This festival drew thousands of people every year and was one of the biggest Bay Area manifestations of what's sometimes humorously called the "great folk scare" of the 1950's and 1960's. Photos, stories, some audio, and a historical essay that pulls it all together. Check it out!

# The Village Out West: The Lost Tapes of Alan Oakes by Steve Goldfield

The folk music scare of the 1960s had many centers around the country. The one in Greenwich Village in New York is probably the best-known and the best-documented. Another, in Berkeley, California, is probably less well-known outside the

San Francisco Bay Area, but it was also a wellspring of traditional music.

This new double CD from Smithsonian Folkways, available for purchase at https://folkways.si.edu/the-village-out-west,

describes itself as "Field Recordings of the 1960s California Folk Music Scene". There's a good article about it in the San Francisco Chronicle <u>here</u>. There's a lot of great music on these two CDs! They were produced by three people I know, two of whom I have met. Deborah Robins found the tapes, Hank Sapoznik helped with the liner notes, and Jeff Place works for the record label. I also knew/know many of the performers on this recording, so I am going to discuss it both in terms of the music, as well as of the people themselves.

The first cut on CD 1 is "Beaumont Rag", ably fiddled and picked by Hank Bradley, Rick Shubb, and Doc Watson. I have never met Rick or Doc, though I have some of Rick's capos, and I have seen both perform live. I first met Hank in Mt. Airy, North Carolina in 1994. I had spent the day hanging out with Tennessee fiddler Ralph Blizzard listening to him jam. Finally, nobody was left but Ralph and I, and Ralph insisted that I get out my banjo and play with him. That was when Hank walked up. Since then, we have crossed paths many times, and I once jammed with him at a party at his cousin's house. This marvelous trio was also captured playing "Orange Blossom Special," "Ragtime Annie," "Billy in the Lowground," and "O, Them Golden Slippers." Doc also sings solo on Carson Robison's "The Clouds Gwine Roll Away" and on "The Billboard Song."

Hank also appears with Sandy Rothman and Doc Watson; they play "Cherokee Shuffle." I also know Sandy and have seen him perform. Sandy plays banjo, but he is also a fine guitarist. I have a favorite memory of him at a hotel festival on the San Francisco Peninsula. Sandy was performing on stage in a guitar duet with another friend of mine, Steve Pottier. Sandy had played in Bill Monroe's band, and Bill was in the audience. Bill called out from the audience that he wanted to join them on stage. Steve and Sandy invited him up, and he joined them.

Larry Hanks and Roger Perkins sing Pete Seeger's "Oh, Had I a Golden Thread." I don't remember when I first met Larry, who is also Deborah's husband, but I once went to a birthday party at his house. I replaced Ron Tinkler on banjo in a jam with Harry Liedstrand, and I looked over my shoulder to see Larry accompanying us on a jaw harp. Larry also appears with Mark Spoelstra to sing Woody Guthrie's "Walking Down that Railroad Line." I have never met Mark, but in 1963, I saw him perform at a folk festival at Williams College. Mark also sings his "Play Run Run." Larry appears in other combinations. First, he joins Roger Perkins, Kathy Larisch, and Carol McComb to sing "Northfield." I know Carol, too. Then Larry sing's Woody's "Talking Fishing Blues." Larry did a medley of "Charlie's Neat and Charlie's Sweet" and "Weevilly Wheat" with Jerry Houck and Tom Ninkovich. Kathy and Carol also sang Richard Fariña's "Swallow Song" and "Searchin'" with Will Scarlett, whom I know, on harmonica. Jerry Houck also sang "Sweet Sunny South."

I never met Ron Hughey, Frank Hicks, and Pete Everwine, who perform "Westphalia Waltz," but I heard a lot of stories about them at the old Sweet's Mill folk music camp. The waltz originated in Poland, and my friend, Joe Weed, produced an hourlong documentary

(http://www.joeweed.com/documentaries/westphal ia waltz.htm) in which he traced it back to its source. Hughey and Hicks also combined to play "Good Night Waltz."

LaWanda Ultan sings "Raggedy Pat" a cappella. I met LaWanda at the Mill, and I once went to a party at her house.

The Sweet's Mill Mountain Boys with Kenny Hall play "8<sup>th</sup> of January," "Girl I Left in Sunny Tennessee" (joined by Jim Ringer and Ron Tinkler), "Texas Quickstep," "Fire on the Mountain," "Paddy Won't You Drink Some Cider," and "The Lost Trapper." I met Kenny at the Mill, too, and had the chance to jam with him a lot, and perform once. Just before Kenny died, a friend and I drove to a Basque restaurant in Fresno, where there was a weekly jam. Kenny was brought in a wheelchair and put right next to me.

Merritt Herring sings "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," "Down, Down, Derry Down," and "The Curlew's Song." Merritt used to lead a singing session at the Mill, and I went to it a few times.

I never met bluesman Mississippi Fred McDowell, who sings "Write Me a Few of Yo' Lines" and "Don't Mistreat Nobody (Cause You Got a Few Dimes.)" But I was fortunate to have met the amazing guitarist Rev. Gary Davis in 1963. My older brother was taking guitar lessons from the Reverend, and my brother brought me up to his apartment and introduced me. That evening the Reverend performed at a benefit for the upcoming March on Washington, and we went to that, too. Gary Davis does "Gimme That Old Time Religion," "Baby, Let Me Lay It on You," and "Hesitation Blues" on this recording.

Dr. Humbead's New Tranquility String Band plays Charlie Poole's "Milwaukee Blues." The band consisted of Jim Bamford, Mac Benford, and Sue Draheim. I first met Mac in Mt. Airy. Mac drove in, and my friend, Gail Gillespie, said "Let's go bother Mac." The three of us jammed together. Sue was my second fiddle teacher, and I took a few lessons from her. I first saw her in the Any Old Time String Band.

Gene Bluestein sings "Talking Union." I never met Gene, but his sons Evo and Jemmie are friends of mine. Jemmie told me that Gene was the first director of Sweet's Mill when it became a music camp.

Kilby Snow, an amazing autoharpist, sings "All My Friends Are Gonna Be Strangers" and "Bringing Mary Home."

Caroline Paton sings a lovely version of "Long Time a-Growing" and then joins Sandy Paton to do "Sardines and Pork and Beans" and "I'm a Rover and Seldom Sober."

Jerry Houck does "Mardi Gras Dance." Don Hollins (aka Abel Fortune) sings "The Lady of Carlisle." Ed Trickett performs "Duna." Sandy and Jeanie Darlington sing Woody's "When the Curfew Blows." Roger Renwick does "Jimmy Whelan."

Dad Crockett of Crockett's Kentucky Mountaineers fiddles "Hoop-e-Kack" backed up by Frank Hicks. A few years ago, I met fiddler Cindy Crockett, whose husband is a grandson of Dad Crockett.

Allan Macleod, whom I don't know but who later performed in a duo with my buddy, Dick Holdstock, sings "The Hounds Are Out (The Innocent Hare)."

# **December Board Meeting Highlights**

**Finances**—Dave Sahn reported that the books for the year ended 8/31/2021 have been sent to Dave Simon, our tax preparer.

**Zoom**—Ed runs 60 meetings per year on Zoom. These meetings are recurring. Other club events are one, two or three per year – Harmony, the summer camp-outs, the folk festivals, etc.

It was moved/seconded/passed to authorize the purchase of an additional Zoom account for the one to several time per year events.

**Boulder Creek legacy**—Phyllis and Thad are working on a retrospective on the many years the club had summer camps at Boulder Creek. They will seek reminiscences from club members through the folknik, the Harmony list and the website.

**Folknik**—Donna's last folknik went out in late November. Daniel is the interim editor. He is working to simplify production. His thought is that a Word doc converted to PDF form for publication is the way to go.

Website/membership—The new membership directory can be reached at <u>https://sffmc.org/member-directory</u>. To access or be in the directory, one must be a paid-up member. According to Daniel, there have been lots of renewals, most if not all Camp Harmony related. It was suggested that postcards and/or emails to lapsed members could be a good idea.

**Camp Harmony**—There have been lots of sign-ups. The workshops schedule is almost finished, which may bring in more participants.

**Summer camps**—We are confirmed at Camp Herms for the Memorial Day and Labor Day camps. A wedding is scheduled at Herms for July 4<sup>th</sup>. Hali has called and emailed Melissa Yarns, who took our deposit for the camps, to see if it's possible to still have our camp there, working around the wedding. She has not had a reply. Hali will try to contact her after the holidays, early in January.

# January Board Meeting Highlights

**Finances**—The Club money is categorized by event. We need to keep track separately for Camp Harmony Campership and SFFFF donations. We currently have enough money in our accounts so that we don't have a present danger of spending the wrong funds. Daniel, Valerie and Dave monitored and dealt with fraudulent charges that came through Stripe. Stripe is the dues payment processor for credit and debit card dues payment. The issues have all been resolved thanks to the hard work of the three of them. No bogus transactions have appeared since the minimum payment was changed from \$1 to \$5. Hopefully this will not recur.

Website—Daniel: Responsiveness (making the website pages look good on any screen) wasn't working well, so the design of some parts of the site (About Us and Resources) were changed. The information is still there, but it looks different. He thinks it looks better than before. Our plans for summer campouts will now be a primary topic on the front page.

**Folknik**—*Daniel:* The last issue was his first issue as editor. The Folknik is now formatted as one Word document and we don't need the Adobe software at all. He will do two more issues and see if someone else can then take it on. This issue can be a template for future issues.

Daniel took on the job of sending out the paper Folkniks and is hoping someone else can take it over. There are only 8 that get sent out but they need to get copied at a copy store and have to go to the post office to be weighed. (Any takers out there?)

**Camp Harmony**—*Amelia:* We had over 500 registered campers including people from Australia, Europe and Asia. We had some highly disruptive and pushy individuals unmuting, interrupting others, etc. They were not adhering to the etiquette rules. We need a policy in place with guidelines about how to deal with such people. We had over 70 workshops and lots of attendees but there was an issue with burnout of organizers. How do we make our events feel inclusive and keep slurs out of our community? This needs to be addressed.

There will be a virtual Spring Harmony.

*Daniel:* We have the same problem with inperson events as to how many volunteers we have in relation to the amount of work. It's an issue with everything we do.

*Charlie:* It's less obvious how much work there is to put on an online festival or camp. At in person camps, if something needs to be done, it's easy to find someone and get them to help. Charlie will send an email to Walker Creek reserving next year's camp.

Daniel: We really need to address what Amelia has brought up and deal with this in the future. Rather than etiquette suggestions we need a Code of Conduct and an authority structure. We should continue this conversation and flag it for our next meeting.

**SFFFF**—The committee had a brief discussion about what to do. Normally things would already start but they will need to see if a live event would be feasible. Daniel will be willing to head this for one more year.

**Cyprian's**—Ed reports that is it doing well. They get about 25-30 virtual participants on Friday nights.

Tuesday's is much like Cyprian s but with about half the attendance.

# February Board Meeting Highlights

**Zoom accounts**—We have purchased a second Zoom account for the club, to be used for events that occur one or several times per year. The account Ed has used and continues to use is for meetings that occur many times per year.

Faith's buttons—Carol Craig, Faith's daughter, offered the club a number of buttons commemorating club events over a number of years. Daniel recommended that we accept the buttons for historic reasons. One of the board members will pick up the buttons from Carol and bring them to a future board meeting. It was suggested that the buttons and other historic items might be kept in the storage unit in Richmond.

**Google Drive**—Daniel pointed to the board's Google Drive as an underused tool. He suggested that board minutes and financials, etc. be kept on the drive. Hali volunteered to put the minutes she has on her computer into the drive. Amelia suggested that a picture of items put into/kept in storage be taken and kept in the Google drive. Not all board members know how to use the drive, so a tutorial could make sense. Website—Daniel brought up the issue of adding links to the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws to the website. After discussion, it was moved by Amelia, seconded by Bob and approved by the board to add links to these documents to the site.

**Racism**—There was an extended discussion of songs that in today's climate can be considered racist or otherwise offensive. Amelia suggested there is a strong need to address this issue going forward and noted that she has talked to at least one other organization about how it is addressing this issue. It was decided that Amelia and Hali will look into what others are doing and make recommendations.

**Spring Camp Harmony**—Amelia said things are going OK.

**Camp Harmony**—Charlie reported that he talked to Pam at Walker Creek. She said they are not making reservations at this time. We hope we will have an in-person camp this year end.

**SFFFF**—Daniel noted that not knowing if the festival will be online or in person makes much planning very difficult.

**ECFFF**—Bob echoed Daniel's comment. ECFFF is in October, four months after SFFFF.

# Folk: a Dirty Four-Letter Word?

What is it about folk music that makes some folk or folksy artists want to disown it and smug rockers want to sneer?

Think how many acoustic musicians and people associated historically with folk have sought to create distance. Briefly fashionable singersongwriters seem to recoil in horror from being "pigeon-holed". Folk, to many, is a dirty word.

There is nothing especially new in this. Maddy Prior, a product of the folk clubs of England who has made a living singing (superbly) traditional songs put to amplified accompaniment, once insisted Steeleye Span was a rock band. And I have never forgotten one moment when the excellent trio Therapy - Dave Shannon, Sam Bracken and Fiona Simpson – played at my folk club, the Spinning Wheel, in Darlington, in about 1970.

Dave – sadly no longer with us – paused after a selection of self-compositions and at least one Cat Stevens hit to introduce a traditional song (it may have been *Blackwaterside*). "This," he said, "is one for anyone who strayed in here expecting to hear folk music."

A young character in the BBC radio soap, *The Archers,* was once heard mocking his parents' fondness for old Fairport Convention records.

Often enough, it depends on what you are prepared to label folk. But some venues are nervous, too, about being linked too closely with the genre.

Among the artists who have appeared or are due to perform at the Old Cinema Launderette in Durham are the Unthanks, Martin Carthy, Kathryn Roberts and Sean Lakeman, Jez Lowe and Peggy Seeger.

Yet the co-owner, Richard Turner, was quick – and right - to pounce when I sloppily omitted the negative from this sentence in a recent Salut! Live item: "...Richard is keen to point out that it is not a folk venue".

"It is not a folk venue at all," he wrote. "We have artists from across the board." But what followed felt like the twist of a knife:

"We are getting less and less folk. There doesn't seem to the audience for it."

In reality, this too is familiar territory. How often have we been told that while there is indeed an audience for such people as Kate Rusby, Oysterband, Bellowhead and its descendants, Show of Hands and assorted Lakemans (Kathryn Roberts and Cara Dillon included), that audience is a predominantly a middle-aged or older one.

Nor is the tendency to talk down folk a recent phenomenon. A grim introduction to Kat Lister's interesting Guardian interview with Melanie Safka read: "Overlooked and underestimated, Melanie was framed as a winsome folkie and left out of the pantheon of greats." The subtext could not be clearer. Find yourself labelled folk and you can forget about ever being taken seriously, let alone thought of as great.


I'd say that is or ought to be utter nonsense. So many of the artists featured at Salut! Live over its 13 years or so of existences ooze greatness that it is pointlessly difficult to choose where to start.

But maybe they succeed or win respect despite rather than because of identification with folk. Maybe I am just an unreformed and unreformable folkie living in the past. And maybe we should stop calling our music folk and just go on enjoying it for what and whatever it is.

Is there a debate worth having? Is folk, indeed, still strong and resilient enough to rise above mainstream disdain?
