SFFMC Memorial Day weekend coming soon!

SFFMC has now had three very successful multi-day musical gatherings at Camp Herms, a 20acre Boy Scout camp high in the El Cerrito hills. We'll return again to Camp Herms on Memorial Day weekend, from Friday afternoon May 26 until Monday May 29. Rates for adults will be \$15/day for day use, or \$25/night, per person. Kids under 15 are \$10/day for day use, \$10/night, per person. We will require proof of Covid-19 vaccination to attend.

Most attendees come for day use, but there is also a lot of room for tent, RV and primitive cabin camping. There is no pre-registration or prepayment. Please bring cash or checks made out to SFFMC. You don't need to be a club member to attend, but you're welcome to join or renew before or at camp! Live and In Person on Saturday July 8!

SFFMC's San Francisco Free Folk Festival will be live and in person this year, for the first time since 2019. This year's festival will be an outdoor event on Saturday July 8 from 12 noon until 6 pm. It will be held in in the Music Concourse area of Golden Gate Park, between the DeYoung Museum and the California Academy of Sciences.

Performances will be on the bandshell stage at one end of the Music Concourse and will be cosponsored by Illuminate, which hosts an ongoing concert series there. Workshops will be near the fountains in the middle of the concourse. The whole event will be co-sponsored by San Francisco Recreation & Parks.

Amelia Hogan, Taking Flight

This is Amelia's most recent CD, self-produced and co-produced by Ray Frank.

Imagine a musical journey through a dark and forbidding tunnel or a bitter winter or even a global pandemic and then imagine coming out the other side into bright sunlight, a joyous spring, or a world filled with hope and a possible major decline of injustice, intolerance, and economic privation. Amelia Hogan and friends have given us a look into

the face of grief, sorrow, and despair through the 16 magical and poetic musical examples.

Of the 16 songs, one is a Hogan original, the title piece, Taking Flight, with others being traditional and coming from a variety of sources including David Francey, Laurie Lewis, Anais Mitchell, Jez Lowe, and even the legendary Scottish poet Robert Burns.

Ably assisting Hogan are a group of some of the finest musicians on the West coast of today's music scene. They include Ray Frank on guitar, banjo and harmony vocals, David Brewer on whistle and bodhran, Richard Mandel, in banjo, guitar and bouzouki, Maureen Brennan on Celtic harp, Rebecca Richman on fiddle and concertina, and Christa Burch and Marla Fibish on harmony vocals.

Personal album favorites include:

- Twa Corbies, a classic Scottish ballad of a corpse being devoured by carrion birds representing invading soldiers
- The beautiful and haunting Manx lullaby sung to children to relieve aching hearts
- The moody and somber Hunting the Wren with its reference to outcast women and their constant struggles to survive
- Great Big Roaming Ass, a playful tale of a friendship between a man and his donkey which may prove just who one's friends really are, and
- Taking Flight, with its positive hopes for a better world to come, in spite of grief, sorrow and personal loss.

A personal observation: yours truly has a definite penchant for songs sung in a minor key. Of the 16 selections on this recording, 6 of them are sung in minor keys with melodies that are simply breathtaking and awesome. Many of the songs use allegories of birds, mingling the emotions of loss and sorrow with hope and healing and the ability to find beauty in the midst of hardship.


This recording comes very highly recommended. Or, to put it another way, an old Chinese proverb says, "a grief shared is half a grief, a joy shared is twice a joy." Sing on, Amelia Hogan, always sing for us and even more importantly, teach us to sing.

Alan Ackerman died in Berkeley, California on February 23, 2023 after a three-year struggle with dementia.

He was born in Des Moines, Iowa, February 8, 1947 and grew up in Texas, where his parents, Louise Rodgers Ackerman and William Blake Ackerman, settled. He graduated from Reed College with a BA in mathematics in 1968, and in 1972, completed an MA, also in Math, at UC Berkeley and UC Santa Cruz. Alan lived in Berkeley for 52 years, working as a computer programmer for various companies. He met his wife, Betsy St. Aubin, there and they married in 1983.

Alan was a great nature enthusiast; weekend hikes and many family camping trips were cherished experiences. Over the years he became a wonderful wildflower photographer.

He loved reading, particularly natural science books and mysteries. He also much enjoyed music and dance; singing was his greatest delight. He was a longtime member of the SF Folk Music Club and participated in several folkdance groups as well as folk singing groups. He was an exuberant English and Scottish country dancer.

Alan adored being a father and grandfather. He had the most beautiful smile! He was preceded in death by his sister, Nancy Schofield (Ken). Alan is survived by his wife, Betsy, daughters, Clara Ackerman and Esther Ackerman (David), brother, George Ackerman (Diane), nephews David Schofield (Diane) and Blake Schofield (Jessica) and grandsons, Calvin and Sasha Manshardt.

RIP, Georgia Schwimmer 8/29/46-12/23/22

If you were around folk music and dance in Berkeley in the 80s, you probably knew my beloved sister Georgia. She was bright and funny, and loved good conversation. She played violin/ fiddle and loved dancing. She went to lots of pickin' potlucks, music parties, and Orphans' Christmas.

At Interlochen music camp for two years, she played classical violin. After high school in New Jersey, she went to McGill for a year but came back to attend Barnard. Like me, she majored in French and loved going to France, where she was fluent. My brother remembers getting The Feminine Mystique from her, which changed his life. In 1981, she bought a house in Albany, CA. There, she married musician and computer expert Len Edmondson. In 1985, she gave birth to Josh; you might have seen him asleep at the side of the stage, while they danced.

She taught French and tried other jobs, but in the end chose to be a healer like our dad, whose passion was medicine. She did family therapy, brief therapy, and hypnosis. And trained many people for the difficult therapy exams.

She was a beautiful and exuberant dancer, and she and second husband John Bergmann did English and contra dancing in Berkeley, SF, Seattle, and even upstate New York. She and a friend went to a dance week in Alaska. At a family gathering in New Jersey, I remember her driving off at night to Brooklyn, to dance to Grand Picnic. John and Georgia took his two children and Josh ("blended family") on adventures they remember fondly all over Europe and to jungle in Costa Rica. Each December, when I came across country to visit and go to Camp Harmony, we made a huge salad together for Orphans Christmas.

In the end, Alzheimer's made it unsafe for Georgia to live at home, despite John's infinite patience. It destroyed her dream of staying with him in the space they'd beautified together, full of light,

nearby Silverado, he spent hours holding her hand through rapid reality changes, and sang or even danced with her. He often connected us to her via iPad on FaceTime.

Eventually a kind young social worker helped her get outdoors more. She remembers Georgia "always talking about helping others (building buildings for people, feeling protective of people) She had a good sense of humor, very warm demeanor, laughed at jokes. Her chuckle was a defining character of hers, and her bright smile."

She is sorely missed as we remember her bright spirit. RIP, dear Georgia. If you'd like to donate in her honor, that would be lovely, to your favorite feminist or Alzheimer's group.

The Men that God Made Mad

First, the lyrics. Then, I'll write a bit about the song.

Far, far from Clifden's rocky shore O'er the broad Atlantic sea, The Battalion of St. Patrick tired Of harsh brutality. No more abuse or bigotry, Their angry cry wholehearted. Near Matamoras, lives were lost; That's when the fighting started.

Chorus:

Who were those men, what was the crime For which their lives were wasted? Did they rob or rape, or was their fate As the poet once related? Those great Gaels of Ireland The men that God made mad? Their wars were never merry But all their songs were sad.

Land of the free meant liberty
To the U.S. Army's Irish.
Till James K. Polk, he sent them south
To civilize the Spanish.
In a war to extend slavery
And unjust exploitation,
They'd not repeat what Cromwell did
To their poor Irish Nation.

Repeat chorus

At L'Angustura, Irish blood drenched the sun-baked clay.
And Mexico still honors those Brave men who died that day.
But the worst was yet to come In the hour that war was ended.
When General Scott hung the Irishmen To celebrate with vengeance.

The song was written by Ron Kavana, and arranged by the duo Niamh Parsons and Graham Dunne.

But ... it's not that simple. The phrase that constitutes the title of this song, and the text of the second half of the chorus, come from the epic poem The Ballad of a White Horse by English writer G.K. Chesterton:

For the great Gaels of Ireland Are the men that God made mad, For all their wars are merry, And all their songs are sad.

Notice the difference in the last two lines? The original poem says all their wars ARE merry, AND their songs are sad, while the song says their wars were NEVER merry, BUT all their songs were sad. Strange lyric changes. I couldn't find anything to explain why the songwriter made those changes. I suppose the first change might be because the poet had been English, not Irish, and romanticized the "cheerful" Irish as soldiers, and the songwriter wanted to fix the perception? As far as the second change, the word "but" makes no sense to me. "But" usually introduces a thought that varies from what was just stated. Sad songs are certainly not at variance with sad wars...

So what about the rest of the song? A little-known chapter in U.S.-Mexican history (and certainly not one about which I knew much before researching this song) is that of *El Batallón de los San Patricios* or "St. Patrick's Battalion." In a nutshell, St. Patrick's Battalion was a group of immigrants, mostly of Irish descent, who fought alongside the Mexican Army during the Mexican-American War (1846-1848). Anti-Catholic sentiment in the States gave Irish-American soldiers little reason to continue to pay allegiance to the stars and stripes. This song describes why these men were fighting in Mexico, and what happened to them.

March Board Meeting Highlights

Board Membership: Amelia announced that she is resigning from the Board immediately. She is also stepping back some from Harmony. Charlie spoke for the board and the club in thanking her for her work for the club. Ed invited her to continue as an advisor to the club.

Membership — Charlie: Mailchimp will be cheaper paying as we go instead of paying for an all-you-can-eat package.

Spring Harmony — *Hali:* It went well, smoothly. We had attendees from Japan to the British Isle, 200 plus registrants.

Camp Hermes and Summer Campouts — Hali: For all three campouts, maximum rental cost per campout will be a maximum of \$900 for each day (\$2,700 for all three).

SFFFF — Daniel: Performance space is in the band shell and includes sound equipment and operators. The solution for workshops will be outside and needs to be far enough away from the bandshell to minimize sound bleed. We will need to bring chairs. Cost is only \$150. Hours may be 11 to 6.

ECFFF — *Bob:* We are preparing our paperwork request to the city and the Community Center.

Cyprian's — *Ed:* I talked to Glen, who is positive on going live but hasn't yet talked to the vicar. The plan going forward is to have 1st and 3rd gatherings on Zoom and 2nd and 4th live.

April Board Meeting Highlights

Board Departure: We have one less board member since Amelia has left the Board, but technically, we don't have a vacancy. It would be good to find a younger woman. We don't need to have another Board member, but we are thinking about it.

East Bay Fiddlin' & Pickin': They need a vax coordinator. Nancy, Joan, and Ed pitched in on Sunday. Eventually they will need a new supplies/money person. Someone needs to coordinate the volunteers. Leadership roles need to be filled.

Camp Herms: Hali will call the Ranger and Nathalie to find out what our options would be for July 4th weekend. She has been told that the camp is being

used for a day camp on Friday and Monday, and we could only have it Saturday and Sunday. Currently 75% of our campers are day use. Could we come in Friday night and stay through Sunday night? She will call them tomorrow. Memorial Day and Labor Day are confirmed, and the deposits have been paid.

SFFFF: Things are gradually coming together. Pete Kronowitt and Daniel went to Golden Gate Park for a meeting on Monday. The current version of the bandshell contract between SFFMC and Illuminate says the bandshell performance will go to 4 PM but the park people said 5 PM would be okay if Illuminate ok's that. Pete will discuss with Illuminate -- 12-4 is their regular concert series time. We will use the bandshell (as our main stage, in collaboration with Illuminate) plus four smaller areas around the middle fountain of the "Music Concourse" which are relatively near the bandshell (as workshop locations). We can have pop-ups in three of the four areas and the other area can have chairs under the trees. Illuminate will provide sound equipment and engineers for the bandshell. The four spaces near the fountain will be unamplified. There will be no instrument check. There are food trucks nearby. Donations could be collected onsite but there is the possibility that someone could run off with a can, so online donations will be encouraged. 100 chairs will be rented from Abbey Rents. Space needs to be reserved on their truck to bring in supplies. Charlie advised not to use Samsonite chairs. If you google Golden Gate Park Music Concourse you can see the area online. Daniel estimates the total cost of the festival including park staffing will be roughly \$2700 plus the cost of insurance.


Cyprian's: The Vicar has not gotten back to Glen regarding pricing/areas of use, so we're still waiting to hear from her. Rebecca Parks volunteered to set up a hybrid, but most people would want to come live. Ed is suggesting 1st and 3rd Fridays at Cyprian's, and 2nd and 4th Fridays on Zoom. There is a

good turnout online of people who would not be able to come to San Francisco.

Tuesdays: The Socially Responsible Song Group now meets after the SFFMC Tuesday event.

El Cerrito Free Folk Festival: Bob Helliesen contacted the EC Community Center about reserving the center on Saturday, October 14. Jessica at the center is waiting to get approval from the Arts Commission before approving anything. Bob must still meet with the Arts Commission.

Camp Harmony 2023-2024: Charlie has still not gotten anything in writing. He will once again send a "gentle reminder" in hopes that we can get a signed contract. We currently have no other alternative to Camp Newman as other sites are either not open during the holiday season, are too small, or are otherwise not appropriate for our group.
