Mary McCaslin has passed away

Folk singer and songwriter Mary McCaslin died on October 2 at 75 years old. She died of progressive supranuclear palsy, a neurological disease with symptoms similar to Parkinson's disease. Ms. McCaslin grew up in Southern California and died in Hemet, California, but she also had strong connections to the Bay Area, having lived in Santa Cruz for over 25 years until 2016. She released a number of albums in the 1970s and 1980s including the California-themed *Sunny California* in 1986.

In its obituary, the New York Times described her as "a pure-voiced folk singer who sang plaintive laments for the fading Old West, reimagined pop and rock classics as mountain ballads and was an innovator of open tunings on the guitar." Mickie Zekley has passed away

He was the founder of Lark Camp, the original owner of the Lark in the Morning music store, and a multi-instrumentalist traditional musician. He will be missed.

British Abolition of the Slave Trade: Part 3

This is the third of three short articles on "three influential Williams", based on Dick Holdstock's book Again with One Voice: British Songs for Political Reform, 1768 to 1868 (Loomis House Press, 2021)

The first two parts of this series introduced the Mansfield Decision of 1772 and then the Society for Effecting the Abolition of the Slave Trade (SEAST), established in 1787, and its anthem "The African's Complaint" authored by William Cowper.

Here is where we pick up with our third "William": Member of Parliament William Wilberforce. He was a gentleman, a man of faith and integrity, a generous friend and philanthropist. He was blind to many inequities but was a persistent advocate to end the slave trade. As the main abolitionist voice in Parliament since the establishment of SEAST, he had brought bill after bill to the floor without success. Finally, the tide turned within the walls of government, and other advocates, for reasons virtuous or political, rallied to the cause. In 1807 the Abolition of Slave Trade Act was passed.

A third song from Dick's book, "The Voice of Africa" (AWOV, No. 52; Roud V30283), appeals to Britain as a nation that embraces freedom. Its first four stanzas are presented as the voice of Africa.

"O Britain! Thou chiefest of isles in the ocean, "Where Freedom and Wealth, with the Graces now dwell!

"To thee sable Africa pays her devotion:
"O Heaven of the Earth, pity Africa's hell!

But the fifth stanza responds to this appeal in the voice of Britain's national conscience:

O Africa, cease! All thy wrongs we have ponder'd Though long we ill-treated thy sons on their shore; Like demons, not men, we thy treasures have plunder'd

And worse!!! — These foul infamies brand us no more!

As Men now we view you; —as Brethren, though sable;

Your kindred, now prov'd, we shall never disown; And should ingrate France our best efforts disable, Your cause, our Jehovah shall plead as his own!

This final stanza situates the song after the passing of the Abolition of Slave Trade Act. When Britain outlawed its own industry of trading slaves, it began to police the oceans to force other countries to abandon the practice as well. This song scolds France for continuing to ply the trade to its own colonies.

There's much more to the saga than can be related here, or that these songs reveal. For more than a quarter century after the British slave trade was legally abolished in 1807, full emancipation remained elusive. (The United States also abolished its international slave trade in 1807, a story with its own tangles.)

Wilberforce continued diligently as an MP, and played a leading role in the Anti-Slavery Society established in 1823, until his health failed. The song "Negro Slavery" (AWOV, No.89; Roud V28107) pleads for full freedoms, and also acknowledges the efforts of Wilberforce:

Now's the time and now's the hour,
To Parliament petitions pour,
Oh Britons pray exert your power,
To set the Negro free,
Who stood forth in time of need,
Who did so nobly for us plead,
Who wished the Negro slave was free,
'T'was Wilberforce 't'was he.

Only after the Reform Bill of 1832 passed was The Slavery Abolition Act of 1833 also passed, by newly seated MPs who had been elected in part for their campaign positions on slavery. But, as we all know, history continues to unfold in precarious ways. Legal rights are not always reflected in actual life circumstances, and the rights of people of all colors are questioned in nearly every country on earth to this day.

A Nice Story

I was at 885 Clayton St. in September, and was looking at a vinyl LP that I'd never heard --"Faith Petric" by Faith Petric. I thought, "someday I wish I could find a copy of that." Later, after my other doings were done, I remembered that I had once found a copy of Faith's "As We Were" album at Amoeba on Haight St., years ago. I decided to stop in to take a look, and, voila! There it was!

When I got it home, I discovered that there were a few local newspaper articles and a couple of letters inside. The letters were from Faith to Larry Kelp, a music critic for the Oakland Tribune. The first letter was typewritten, dated 1980, shortly after release of the album. It began, "Dear Mr. Kelp," and thanked him for the review he wrote about her and her album. She said he got and expressed well what the LP was all about, with clarity and sensitivity. "This is not a routine thank-you-to-the-press -- I really do like what you've said a lot. I'd like to meet you some day. Kate Wolf tells me you're quite as wonderful in person as you are in print." Signed, Faith Petric.

The second letter was handwritten, dated 11 years later, and begins, "Dear Larry," and was apparently sent with her LP "As We Were", and signed simply, "Faith". She thanks him for the chance to talk about an Earl Robinson show on his KPFA program.

I never read the Oakland Tribune (an SF Chron guy) and had never heard of this Larry Kelp before, but he certainly seems to have won Faith's approval, and now I have the record Faith sent him 40 years ago. I look forward to hearing it.

2022 Hardly Strictly Bluegrass Festival

Hardly Strictly Bluegrass was founded in 2001 by a foundation set up by the late investment banker Warren Hellman. It's a free three-day festival at Golden Gate Park in San Francisco, and as the name implies, the event is fairly genre agnostic, although performers typically skew more toward the roots and Americana side of the musical spectrum.

Hardly Strictly is a much looser event than most other festivals. Yes, there's security, but attendees are encouraged to bring blankets and make a picnic. It's essentially the ultimate day out in the park, with a soundtrack of dozens of nationally recognized bands. They can dance to the music. And people are even allowed to bring their dogs!

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, the 2020 and 2021 editions of the fest were canceled, replaced by streaming concerts.

But this year the festival was once again held in Golden Gate Park, from 10/1-10/2/22. I may have miscounted on their website, but I believe there were 71 different acts, presented on 6 different stages – the Porch Stage, the Bandwagon Stage, the Banjo Stage, the Rooster Stage, the Swan Stage, and the Towers of Gold Stage.

In 2021, Hardly Strictly's charitable efforts resulted in \$1 million being distributed to 3 organizations responding to critical relief and recovery needs:

Esther's Orbit Room Cultural Revival Project supports a more equitable recovery with a community-led effort to revitalize a historic Oakland "Harlem of the West" music and cultural venue.

Sweet Relief's COVID-19 Fund provides direct grants to musicians and industry workers still facing deep economic challenges. HSB's support is dedicated to folks in the San Francisco Bay Area and New Orleans metro area in honor of our 2021 Come What May production and long connection to these communities.

The Tenderloin Museum's Sounds of the Tenderloin project seeks to uplift and celebrate San Francisco's historic nightlife district, once home to thriving jazz, folk, and rock scenes, with a series of live performances throughout the neighborhood.

September Board Meeting Highlights

Correspondence: There was reference to the Portland Oregon Folk Society, which contacted us and asked us to use our logo on their literature supporting their "FallSong" event and for them to put their information on our Harmony list and Facebook page.

Folknik: Daniel reported that the September issue came out at the end of August. October 15th is the deadline for the next issue.

East Bay Fiddlin' and Pickin': Ed said the September gathering went well. A new coordinator has been found. Outdoor sites are still being sought.

Labor Day Campout: Hali reported the campout was a big success, that we had good attendance and a good time was had by all, even though weather was very warm. We about broke even financially.

Cyprians: Ed reported that Zoom is still going well. The church is not yet willing to consider live meetings.

ECFFF: Bob has gotten approval for us to rent the El Cerrito Community Center (a new venue) and the El Cerrito Arts and Culture Commission has voted to support us with a grant of \$1,250. Time is short but planning is underway.

Camp Harmony: Amelia discussed a survey she has distributed, which has had 40 responders so far. Harmony 2022/2023 will be online again; planning is in the next few weeks.

Walker Creek will not be available to us for our desired time in future years. Camp Newman is promising for the December 2023/January 2024 camp, and rebuilt Newman is reported to be more accessible than before.



October Board Meeting Highlights

Election: Bob Helliesen, Hali Hammer, Thad Binkley, Phyllis Jardine, Daniel Hersh were up for reelection. All stated that they would want to serve another term. Each name was called in turn, and all were re-elected. Charlie had voted in favor of all the Board members' reelection via email, so the Board members mentioned above were reelected unanimously by the Board.

Google Drive Folder: Minutes of 2022 Board meetings have been placed on the drive by Hali. Daniel also has placed some materials on the folder site.

Website: Daniel is keeping it up to date.

Code of Conduct: Amelia says this will need to be worked on by a committee. She would like help from at least one other Board member. She is in communication with people from other organizations who are similarly working on approaches to this problem, but she has been very busy. Daniel is willing to help her. We must come up with a good way to respond to this with the community and preferably with someone who has seen a lot of the club history. Hali is willing to look at what she and Daniel come up with. Jerry: In the past we have asked people to either fix their problem or leave. Hali: If we have something in writing and an incident occurs, we can refer to it directly. Ed: There was an incident at the July 4 gettogether where two people came who were not vaccinated. When that was mentioned by another club member, Ed asked them to leave. They started to argue about, it but when Ed said it was not his decision, it was a decision by the Board and was written into what was expected from people who attended and appeared on the website, they stopped arguing and left.

Bridge Storage and Art Space: Randy tested all the sound equipment and mic stands before the ECFFF, which made setup and running good equipment much easier the day of the festival. He put the good mic stands into one gig bag and ones that were iffy into another. After the festival, he organized all the stored supplies and equipment according to which event it belonged to.

Folknik: The November/December issue is coming out shortly. Deadline for articles is the 15th. Hali will write highlights from September and October Board meetings. Bob will write something up for the ECFFF.

East Bay Pickin' & Fiddlin': October's event was this past Sunday at Hali's. November will be at the Veteran's Center in Albany. There is no site currently for December.

Membership: Daniel reported that people are continuing to pay their dues. Phyllis said that someone told her they tried to pay dues online but couldn't do it. When she suggested they look in the *folknik* for a physical address to send a check, the person said she didn't get the *folknik*. Neither Phyllis nor Thad could remember who that member was, or someone could contact them. We suggested that people could email someone if they needed help, but it's impossible for us to resolve this without knowing who that person is.

ECFFF: The festival went well. One performer tested positive for Covid the day before the festival, so his time was split between two capable musicians. We liked the space, but it was much smaller than El Cerrito High. There is no room for dance. Workshops and performances were well attended. The community center supplied chairs and set them up. Both the committee and the people who came were enthusiastic about the site. The Arts Commission of El Cerrito paid almost the entire expense of the rental and custodial

expense. We don't have numbers, but we had good attendance.

Camp Harmony: Amelia reported that the event will be online this year. Another committee meeting is imminent to work on registration. If anyone feels they can help, they are encouraged to do so. Messages to the Harmony list and other places will be going out

soon. There will be trainings and refreshers for those who can volunteer through November and December.

Spring Camp Harmony: to be planned after Camp Harmony.

SFFFF: No news at this time.
