Singing for Justice Documentary Film Celebrating Faith Petric Launches Crowdfunding Campaign by Estelle Freedman and Christie Herring

Have you ever attended a SFFMC-sponsored song circle/jam, holiday weekend camp-out, or Free Folk Festival? Did you ever hear the Freedom Song Network at a rally or go to a concert at the Plowshares Coffeehouse? Did you ever drop by 885 Clayton Street to sing or jam? You can thank Faith Petric (1915-2013) for inspiring, hosting, and sustaining these and other folk music gatherings during her long years of bringing people together to sing. Faith championed songs of love, humor, and especially of social justice, sharing them around the country and the world as a traveling performer. Her legacy helps sustain the SFFMC today, and her history provides a model of lifelong political and musical engagement.

The documentary film we are producing, Singing for Justice, will tell Faith Petric's story. You can support this effort and celebrate Faith's life by participating in our September crowdfunding events. In September we will launch our online Kickstarter campaign to raise money for our next stage of post-production. Please join us on 9/6 as we honor Labor Day, and especially on Sunday, September 12th (5 p.m. PT, 8 p.m. ET) to celebrate Faith's 106th birthday (b. 9/13/1915). We will share clips from the film, go behind the scenes to talk with the directors, chat with John McCutcheon about Faith, hear testimonials from faithful friends, and end with a singalong. For those who can donate, there will be perks! We will thank you with gifts ranging from one of Faith's CDs to one of her instruments, along with many other surprise treats. Singing for Justice follows Faith from her hardscrabble log-cabin origins in Idaho to her radicalization during the Great Depression, her work as a WWII Rosie the Riveter, her struggles as a single mother harassed by the FBI during the Cold War, and through the flourishing of her post-retirement folk music career. The film reveals a history of American folk music revivals beyond the commercialized music industry, including grass-roots singing to support labor, peace, feminist, and environmental causes. The SFFMC plays a central role in the film, portrayed through photos, videos, and interviews with members.

We have been working together for the past decade to research Faith Petric's life and produce a compelling documentary film, with generous support from many members of the SFFMC. We have shared clips at the past two Free Folk Festivals and we now have a complete rough cut of the film. Before we can proceed to the final edit, however, we need to pause in order to raise funds for production costs: completing the edit, licensing music and archival footage, and finalizing color and sound for the film.

SFFMC Member Directory Online Soon – Please Check Your Information!

The club is modernizing its membership system and step 1 is completed. Each member's data is now available online for you to review. The instructions below guide you in doing that. Once everyone has had a chance to review their data (and update if needed), we will move to step 2, creating a searchable directory that will allow club members to view others' info.

The data you'll review and can update includes your preferences for how your information is shown in the directory (or whether you want to appear at all). The online directory will NOT be public – it will be viewable only by SFFMC members who are logged into the website. Make sure that you're happy with the information that will be shown for your listing. Here's how to do that:

- 1. Go to our web site: https://www.sffmc.org
- 2. Click "Member Login" near the upper right corner of your screen.
- 3. This will take you to a screen that asks for "Username or Email Address" and Password. You don't need to type anything into those boxes now.
- 4. To get a password, **click** "**Lost Password**?", which is in the center of the screen, below the LOG IN button.
- 5. This will take you to a screen that says "Please enter your username or email address. You'll receive a link to create a new password via email." **Type either your email address** (the one that you think is in the SFFMC member database, most likely the email address where you receive email notifications about the *folknik*) **or your username** (usually your first initial followed by your last name, such as jjones for

John Jones) **into the Username or Email Address box.** FYI, if you have a "couple" membership, you will have just one username, which could come from either name -- for example, a couple named John Jones and Sarah Smith could be either jjones or ssmith, but they would have just one username or the other, not both.

- 6. Click the button that says GET NEW PASSWORD.
- 7. You'll then receive an email message, probably from wordpress@sffmc.org, that includes a link that allows you to set a new password.
- 8. Click the link in the email that you receive, then set your desired password. Remember or record that password! Then log into the site with your username/email address and your new password.
- 9. This will take you to https://www.sffmc.org/membership-account where you'll see your membership level (standard, economy, or low income), your membership expiration date, your name, your username and your email. [Please note: if your dues are not currently paid up, you may get a message saying, "You do not have an active membership. Choose a membership level." You can click on "Choose a membership level" to pay your dues.]
- 10. Now **click on "Edit Profile",** which you'll see just below your email address. This will take you to https://www.sffmc.org/member-profile, which will have much more information from your listing in the member database, including your directory listing preferences. If you want to change anything, enter your new information. When you are done, click the UPDATE PROFILE button.
- 11. At the upper right corner of your screen, you'll see "Log Out" in the same place where you saw "Member Login" before. If you want to log out, you can do so. If you run into problems or have questions or concerns, feel free to contact our website administrator at web@sffmc.org or our membership coordinator at membership@sffmc.org.

Abe Feinberg

Long-time folk club member Abe Feinberg passed away peacefully at home on June 22, 2021. He is survived by his wife, Joan Hall Feinberg, and by 3 daughters, a granddaughter and a great grandson, as well as two stepsons.

Abe participated in – and volunteered for – many SFFMC events and activities. For a number of years, he served on the Club's Board of Directors. In addition, Abe and Joan were active in the East Bay Fiddlin' and Pickin' Potlucks; for many years Abe recruited the 12 venues a year where these events were held, and their Oakland home was frequently the site of those musical Sunday afternoons. Abe played the banjo before moving on to mandolin, on which he could follow any melody; in recent years he favored the harmonica.

Abe was an accomplished woodworker and made a number of his own instruments – things of beauty with excellent sound. His carpentry skills were most visible in the floors that he personally laid throughout their home, using hardwood salvaged from a church that was being torn down.

Abe's 95 years encompassed a variety of what must have seemed like different lives. Born in New Brunswick, New Jersey, on February 27, 1926, he went to local schools, and then worked during World War II as an electrician. While employed, he attended and received his BA from Rutgers University. where he developed an interest in education, first taking a position teaching drafting in a high school. Thus began Abe's lifelong fascination with education; he ultimately received his doctorate degree in Curriculum and Instruction.

His battles – in New Jersey and especially in Livermore, California – to bring the best possible education to his students, in spite of personal and religious harassment and lawsuits, as well as strong support from parents and students, marked all his years of teaching. His students always came first. These experiences and others are detailed in his 2011 book, Every Child Left Behind, subtitled "Public Ignorance is the School Administration's Best Friend."

Abe was a devotee of folk music; a stubborn, persistent, and concerned citizen; and an educator up to his last days. He was also a critic of Oakland's public education system and an inveterate writer of letters to local newspapers. Most of all, he was a loving husband and a good friend. He is sorely missed.

SFFMC Survey Results

Last December, the folk club board of directors did a survey of our community. We publicized it on the Harmony List, the SFFMC Facebook group, and the SFFMC website, and we asked people to respond. We were especially interested in finding out more about the best ways to communicate with our members and the local folk community, but we asked (and learned!) some other things about our members too.

114 people responded to the survey. 86 said they were current SFFMC members, while 14 said they were former members. 53 people live in the East Bay, with 14 in San Francisco, 11 in the North Bay, 8 on the Peninsula, 4 in the South Bay, 12 in other parts of California, and 5 out of state.

The biggest age group by far was 61-75 years old, with 74 people. 24 people were 76 or older, 13 were 46 to 60, and just 3 were under 46 years old.

The Harmony List, used by 97 people, was the most-used source of information about SFFMC. The folknik came next, with 83 saying they use it. 79 people said they use our community calendar, either in the folknik or the stand-alone online calendar. 65 said they use the SFFMC website, and 68 said they use the websites of the San Francisco and El Cerrito Free Folk Festivals. 28 respondents use the SFFMC Facebook group.

88 people said they frequently or occasionally attended the San Francisco Free Folk Festival, 80 said they frequently or occasionally attended SFFMC's Camp Harmony, with 68 for the El Cerrito Free Folk Festival, 44 for SFFMC's summer campouts, and 39 for SFFMC's Friday night musical meetings.

Please be aware that was not a scientific survey, and we don't know if the 114 responses we received are representative of the Bay Area folk community as a whole.



Highlights from the July Board Meeting by Hali Hammer

Storage space: The Club has had supplies, a stage, musical equipment, festival signage, etc., scattered at various houses for years. Much of the festival sound equipment has been lent to us by Ed Sherry. He'll be closing his storage space in Richmond and for now, we'll rent a 10x10 storage space in the same facility. He's donating a lot of his equipment to the club. This will be a major consolidation and will provide us with a central location for the club's gear.

Paper folkniks: There are some people who need paper folkniks, but others who want it just for convenience can easily print it themselves, as the format has changed to 8.5 x 11. But it's OK if people want to pay the extra charge for a paper copy.

Database migration: We are in the process of migrating the database to Memberships Pro. After testing and adjustments, we will contact all club members, and let them look at their information to see if it is what they want to appear in an updated directory.

SF Free Folk Festival: We had over 770 people register for the 2021 online festival. [Editor's note: See full article about the 2021 SFFFF in the last folknik.]

July 4 camp: The July 4th weekend campout for 2021 was virtual. It was well attended, and went smoothly. The average workshop got about 20-25 people. About 50 attended Abe Feinberg's memorial workshop.

Labor Day camp: This year's camp will be live at Camp Herms in El Cerrito. It will cost us \$3600 for three days and the club will most likely have to subsidize it. There will be a donation can on the registration table, but we will not be actively soliciting donations from campers. Proof of vaccination will be required. Campers should check the website before attending:

Camp Harmony: Charlie Fenton reported: Three years after the last time we raised our prices, the rates are 17% higher than they were then. We are still working out our camp budget, but the current draft budget is based on reduced attendance given the uncertainties due to the pandemic... We may have a contingency plan for online but we are operating under the assumption that it will be a live event. Walker Creek Ranch has said we would get a full refund if there was a Covid emergency. [Editor's note: This has changed. See article on page 1 of this folknik.]

El Cerrito Free Folk Festival: Bob Helliesen reported: The El Cerrito Free Folk Festival may be held at the El Cerrito Community Center. There is a main hall (big enough to seat 250 people). There is a room (called the garden room) at a distance from the main room that

would work for a second stage. There are two other rooms directly off of the main room, one indoors and one outdoors. There is a smaller room that would work for dance or children's program. Outdoor space is also available. The school district will not even consider renting us EC High School until later in August and it may not be available for a large event due to Covid. [Editor's note: This has changed. See short item re ECFFF in this folknik.]

Cyprian's: Ed Hilton reported: There is still a good turnout on Zoom. Since the Tuesday afternoon song swaps have never been live, they might continue on Zoom and people could be encouraged to join in at those events once Cyprian's goes live.

Next meeting: Tuesday, August 10.

Highlights from the August Board Meeting by Hali Hammer

ECFFF: There was discussion of live vs online festival. (After the Board meeting, a group looked at the El Cerrito Community Center and met with the El Cerrito Arts Commission but will get no support for a live festival from the City of El Cerrito considering the current Covid situation. It looks like this year's festival will be online on Saturday, October 9.)

Camp Herms Labor Day Camp: Camp will be two days, Sat. & Sun. Sept. 4 & 5. Everyone must wear a mask when indoors at a public gathering unless they're eating or drinking. Board members agreed that there doesn't seem to be a dispensation for singing. We should back into parking spaces in case fire necessitates evacuation. Hali talked to Sean, the ranger. He said we may have campers arrive on Saturday at noon. We can bring small propane stoves and lanterns. Those who wish to cook indoors may use the kitchen. Workshops, open mic & other activities will be held outdoors.

Membership: Paid Membership Pro is up and running; the next thing to do is send a notice to current members plus those expired since 2018 to check their information. This will be put in the folknik and the MailChimp notice that will go out about the folknik.


Storage Space: Bob has arranged for us to rent a space at Bridge Storage in Richmond to hold the sound equipment donated to us by Ed Sherry and SFFMC items now stored at member's houses.

Music meetings: Ed reported that Friday meetings are still on Zoom with 20-25 people a night, and are going fine. Tuesdays are also going strong, though there are only half as many participants as Fridays.

Camp Harmony: Board approved the budget. Amelia has been working with Margaret to be ready for a virtual camp in case it is needed. [Editor's note: see Camp Harmony article on page 1 of this folknik.]

New Book by Dick Holdstock

Dick Holdstock, *Again with One Voice: British Songs of Political Reform, 1768 to 1868.*Loomis House Press, Northfield, MN

"There is no more exciting way of bringing historical times to life than through the songs of the people living through them." Thus speaks Frankie Armstrong in one of the epigraphs of Dick Holdstock's new book.

Holdstock had been working on this topic for decades, and the book is a triumph: 120 songs, made over the hundred years between 1768 to 1868, and a commentary to locate them in their historical milieu. I have not the room (nor indeed the expertise) to properly review the book, but I want, by briefly looking at his first song, to bring it to the attention of singers and historians to demonstrate what Holdstock has achieved.

Holdstock's sources for these songs were the big broadside ballad collections at Cambridge University (the Madden Collection, with over 30,000 broadsides) and the Bodleian collection at Oxford University, also with in excess of 30,000 broadsides. To these he added material from several smaller collections, and then began the winnowing process of identifying the songs which might be characterized as songs of political reform.

Britain in 1768 was essentially an autocracy, parliament being run by a gang of supporters of the newly crowned George III. The seats in parliament had been set many years previously, and vast areas of newly populated land, including such cities such as Manchester, had no representation at all, while "rotten boroughs", places where towns had once stood and were now all but empty, still elected members of Parliament.

It was John Wilkes and his struggle for more popular representation and against this autocracy which kicks off Holdstock's collection. Wilkes was a publisher and editor of The North Briton, a satirical newspaper, and Issue No 45 of April 1763 caused his indictment for seditious libel. He escaped to France, but was tried in absentia, and declared an outlaw. He returned five years later to rapturous support, and "Wilkes and Liberty"

became the watchword of the day. Holdstock's first song, "Wilkes and Liberty: In Honour of No. 45" commemorates this historical moment:


In the year sixty-eight will ye Britons be wise And throw off the clouds that darken your skies O will you for freedom and Liberty join To vote for our cause that in time you may shine.

To save a dear country, O will you contrive, And think of the number of good forty-five.

He provides a photo of the first verse of the actual broadside, and the complete song, to be sung to the tune of "Balance a Straw".

The question of locating the tune specified (where it is specified: many broadsides did not so specify) is one of the harder jobs of the cultural historian, which requires a knowledge not just of the published song tune repertoire but also of the extant tunes of the period, and here Holdstock has succeeded in spades. He himself is a sensitive singer, and he brings to the task of marrying a text with an appropriate tune his many long years as a singer.

The struggle for democracy is of course never-ending: beyond Holdstock's period we have the various Representation of the People Acts, which brought about the ever-enlarging scope of democratic reform – working men, women, and here in Canada votes for Chinese, Japanese, East Indians and First Nations people. Holdstock's work is a model for cultural work in these succeeding chapters in the struggle for reform.
